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

I was asked about having meetings again, my response addressed a large enough place that is convenient for the attendees to access that would allow us to congregate. SOLITARY WORKS

Well here it is the last of December and it's "2020 Coming to an END".

Have been busy this year, every thing from trying to build a house (for someone else) to working on and getting my project truck back on the road. Lock downs, stay at home and well other things. This will truly be a year to remember.

Let's see, going over the last few months I've (plus a good friend of mine) (bike and welding buddy) worked with friends (Rusty & Kay plus Tom) to build a cover (out of metal, welded together) for their camper trailer (18' wide 36' long 14ft high), and to getting ready to start on a 1967 Camaro rebuild (sometimes early next year) (starting from the ground up). The body is apart and from what I've been told they have a lot of parts in boxes and a motor (LT1) and trans (AUTO) ready to be installed. The plan is to turn this into a RS/SS Camaro. Plus, they want A/C placed into the car that didn't come factory installed. I'll be doing body to paint job, (make it up as I go). This should be a fun build.

Now let's talk about my Dodge Ram 1998 (4WD 200,000. o miles). Many moons ago I changed out the cats on the exhaust system (keep getting error codes). After pricing a new cat (\$275.00) (dual in single out) with O-2 sensors,2each bung installed on them, I thought this was a little too pricy \$\$\$\$ for me. So, after "kelp" looking, I found a replacement Y-pipe from another source cheaper and install it. Soon after further down the road I notice a lack of power above the 3000rpm range (like I'm pushing a brick wall) (or more like a potato up the tail pipe). This can't be good? Running shorty headers on the engine which only have a 2 ½" ID collector the new Y-pipe that I placed on go down to a 1.95 ID. This in turn causes way too much back pressure. So? After thinking this over I went and bought a new and better grad cat (2 ½" ID inlet/outlet) and built a new exhaust system. Going through a box of mandrel bent pipes (90s/45s and 180 degree) I've been collecting I was able to build a full Dual system (2 ½" all the way out to the chrome tips). I put the single CAT on the pass side exhaust (that's where the O2 sensors are) and the driver side straight back to the muffler. The muffler on the other hand is a flow master dual in dual out but have a 2" inlet and outlet on both pipes. No problem here, I just cut all 4 each of them off and open the holes (4 each) with a die grinder to 2 1/2" and welding on 2 1/2" inlet-outlet pipes and everything fit just like a "STORE BOUGHT TIMEX". It woke the truck back up so much above 3000rpm to around 5500rpm I was as happy as a Tick With My On Dog. Thought about renting it out to one of the logging company to pull stumps up? (NA)

What's next? Well my son called me about 4:30pm one day (he was headed to work, west Texas) and the water pump on his truck went out

and the fan belt went flying off and the lord be with him cause he was able to pull into a rest stop wright when it happen, (out in the middle of nowhere) (30 miles west of Trent Texas). So, myself and wife and 20ft trailer and her truck loaded on the trailer (to let him use to get to the job site) took off on a 400-mile one-way trip to get his truck and make the swap. Believe me a fun 12hr trip. A simple repair (couldn't do this on the side on the road). The seal just went bad after about 2 years use????

Now let's talk tractors. Got around to working on my Wife Daddy's 1953 IH Farmall Super A. it's been setting up about 5 years. The gas in the tank smelled bad and the on/off valve almost wouldn't turn. But any way got it turning and cleaned the tank out and placed fresh gas in the tank. Placed a spare battery on a bar stool with jumper cable and giving it a KISS & A PROMISE and a lot of happy thoughts and almost running the battery down, then removing and cleaning the plugs it came to LIFE (the Tractor Gods are well pleased). The next step was to check the oil and make sure the water pump is not leaking. Theirs no dip stick to be found??? (I see an oil filter and place to put oil in) (But where is the water pump?????) (it has a radiator with fan on the front of the engine) now I'm confused. After going on U-TUBE for about 45 mins I found some one with the same problem and learned there are two check valves on the side of the oil pan (high-low level) (you pore oil in till it runs out the high-level check valve). And as of the water pump there isn't one. The water flow through the system by heating water and going to the top of the radiator which flowed down and the fan pulls air through it cooling it. This is they same way oil is cooled in electrical transformers at electrical sub stations. Now let's check gear oil, ???? unable to find dip stick there either. Pulled fill plug off and looked inside (no oil could be seen) (gears shift was hard to move). Put enough oil in to cover the gears and finally I could move the gear shift. Now after driving it around the yard, oil is coming out of the vent holes????? U-TUBE once again. There is an oil check plug that must be removed when adding oil. It's on the rear section behind a bracket behind the left brake rod going into the rear end (C#%P). I put about 1gal to much! Let extra oil drain out. Now to the battery box (rusted through, no good). Dfghkl;sa P8\I Just happen to have some 3/8" GE Lexan so I made a battery tray and replaced both cables and rewired the tractor. Somewhere in all this I was able to replaced both belts (fan & alternator). Now let's look at her shoes. Been on there since tractor bought (40 years ago), dry rotted and air showing on the inside rear tires. 4 new shoes on here and she look like a runway model now. Starts super easy and when you get it in high gear it does get "SCARY". Just be sure and smile while driving it too show people how happy you were.
