On Monday morning I awoke knowing that traveling to Mustang, Oklahoma on Wednesday was not the thing to do. So, I called everyone and cancelled on the national show. I hope someone else enjoyed my spot and my tickets to the Rousch And it was that way every evening. Someone speech at the dinner on Friday night. So much for that. The plate he sat in front of me had a huge pile of red beans and rice, a fried pork chop, and two pieces of fish. cooked and invited us over. We got up early Thursday morning and brewed a big pot of coffee on a Coleman stove. Some for us and some for anyone who we could find. And it is continuing as the clean-up continues.

I told my neighbors on Riley Street that I hoped that I and them would have the same attitude of pitching in and helping that I experienced in Houma in the event of some tragic event in our area. We're safe. Son's house is going back together. I am back home. And Sally is still up on floor jacks in the garage. The Arends are talking about some show in a far off place in April. Think I'll call and make my reservations.
