

From the Presidents Desk



This month really kicks off the Car Club scene. Since there is something going on every weekend this month, and we have gotten a few new members, I thought it would be a good time to go over some pointers regarding out of town shows and cruises to restaurants for any new members we have gained over the winter.

Any time we cruise anywhere as a club, we always want to have headlights on for safety. We also want to drive 5 miles below the posted speed limit not only to enjoy the cruise to where ever we are going, but also to allow the folks at the end of the line to be able to keep up. If we are traveling on a four lane highway, it is best to stay in a single file line to allow other traffic to pass. We also need to keep from pulling out into the left lane and passing other club members down to a minimum. After all, we are taking our time to get there and enjoy the drive, hence using the word "cruise" to our destination. We all want to arrive alive, as they say in Florida.

It is always a good idea to get driving directions before hand so if you get lost, you can find your way to where we are going. I usually try to send maps, or driving directions via email on out of town trips, and also include fliers or web addresses to sites when available so club members can familiarize themselves with the route. If you don't know how to get somewhere, don't hesitate to ask someone. I always try to get cell phone numbers of some of the members who are going so I can call someone up ahead in a pinch.

If we are going to cruise as a group out of town, we always try to plan a meeting place and time beforehand. The time we talk about in meetings or email is when we are going to leave the designated meeting spot, so be sure to get there at least thirty minutes early. Also, if we pass out a sign up sheet at the club meeting before the event, be sure to sign up and put a cell phone or other number where we can reach you. If you are late to the meeting place, and have signed up, we can call you to see if we need to wait for you or not. Our usual meeting places are the Whataburger on N. Market and I-220 for functions north of town, and the Texas welcome center on I-20 for most East Texas adventures. I always try to send out email the weekend before the event so everyone is aware of the when and where we are going to meet for an event.

The most important thing to remember on any club outing is to have fun and be safe. I try to visit with other club members, talk cars, and meet new people. You never know who you will meet at an event, especially out of town.

John Daniel's Bulletin

Well this is the next letter I'm writing. Last month many of us were at the "Food Bank" not to eat but to fill many boxes with canned food and other things to pass out to the people in need. I believe it went very well.

Lets see what have I done in the past few weeks? My son call me and told me that there was a noise coming from the front of his truck. Keep in mind that we have almost rebuilt the whole truck from bumper to bumper in the past year. That's a new transmission, Transfer case, front differential, u-Joints, knock sensors, valve seals & springs, rear bumper, leveling kit, different console, upgrade on the radio, new radiator with new water pump, and I'm sure there are some other things I can't remember. This time it's the front wheel bearings. Knowing that's hard to replace in a parking lot (West Texas oil field worker) using a few hand tools and a floor jack I just told him I'd hook the trailer on the back of my truck and come and get him (truck also) on the day he finishes up. It's a little over a 500 Mile trip one way (Good 9hrs drive). After going past Fort Worth around 2am I notice some sleet coming down and the temp dropping. Well crud I thought, this ain't good but it's still early and maybe it'll just blow over, (wrong answer). As I got about 300 miles out and needed to stop for a break I notice several tractor trailers getting off the freeway. After dieseling up, grabbing a snack I overheard one of the truckers saying the road (I-20 west of here) is getting bad. Well very little places to park here so I just went over to the other side of I-20 and found a good spot (to park) to "Think This Out" (weather getting bad and temp still dropping). My son called me and said there was about 4" to 5" of snow on the ground at the Oil Rig. Nothing but sleet coming down where I'm at and I had about 1" of ice on my trailer and the roads were icing also, plus my windows were icings up while sitting there (this is not good). I made the decision to drive back east as soon as I could. Placing my truck in 4wd (ice on the road) I started out. Headlights cover with ice and couldn't see the road very well I made back on to I-20 where nothing was coming from the west and nobody going east but me. Driving about 30mph in the middle of the road (could only see those reflectors every 150ft or so) and after about 5mins my son called me telling me I-20 was shut down west bound about 50 miles from where I stopped (trucks slid of the road both sides) (I'd been stuck for around 3hrs on the road (took about 45mins @ 30mph to drive out of the ice storm). Well He made it back

home the next day with the company truck and we went back 3 days later (good weather, around 65 degree) to get his truck. When he was driving it up on the trailer it sounded like a tin can being drug across concrete. Yep! that wheel bearing was so dried up he wouldn't have made it a mile before locking up (even the axle had got hot and started bluing). Well we replaced both sides (new hubs & bearing) and also both CV axles just to make sure. I told him the only thing left was the motor. Motor still runs good, solid and doesn't use any oil or leak. Hopefully this will keep him going for a long time down the road.

Maybe next month I'll be able to start writing about my frame off restore I've been working on. I've got a lot of neat stories about the build, good and not so good.

So I cranked up the Bullitt and backed out of the parking spot at Whataburger with a full stomach. Patty Melt. The name just ooooozes goodness and some grease. Thankfully theydon't charge for extra napkins. The gang went for lunch after the Mustang Club had spent two hours loading up boxes of food over at the Shreveport Food Bank. It was a service project the club had decided to do, one of the charitable works. Members chatted and joked as we worked. Lane and Garrett were the box assemblers, carefully double taping the bottoms so they would hold the weight. There was a pallet full of small boxes donated by customers of Kroger and huge bins full of rice and beans and flour and cans of tuna and cans and boxes and bags and "Who eats all this stuff?" There is a whole industry that makes bent cans of veggies.

The mood was light, and the time flew by. We filled the boxes and taped them shut. They were stacked on a pallet. We had only been there a few minutes when someone yelled the pallet was full, so move it out and bring in an empty one.

After a couple of hours most of those big bins were empty and I remember almost falling into the cavern of corn trying to get a last can out. The Food Bank representative thanked us for the good work, although it really was a breeze for a couple of hours. No back-breaking task at all. He gave us the talk about all the people we were helping and then said we loaded almost three tons of food, one can at a time.

So off to Whataburger! A few days ago at morning coffee a friend told us that he could not get into his office, across from the Dairy Queen in Coushatta. He said his parking lot was full, that people were parked on both sides of the road and at DQ and all up the highway. It seems an employee of the Police Jury was late getting the gate to the fairgrounds open that morning. It was a Tuesday. But it was food distribution day. The one day a month that Pine Belt Multi-Purpose Agency distributes food to the needy in Red River Parish. And there are a lot of them.

I rode by the next day and there were still a few people picking

up food boxes. Then I noticed back in the corner of the lot, you could only see part of the box and sign on the cab of the truck. It was from the Food Bank.
